Historical Society annual car, truck and tractor show is Saturday

The August meeting of the Historical Society of Caseville looked ahead to its annual car, truck and tractor show, which is set for 10 a.m. Saturday (Sept. 19), reviewed its recent Denim & Diamonds event, and made plans for its annual election of officers at the October meeting.

The car show, which is held in conjunction with the Chamber of Commerce's Pumpkin Festival, is co-sponsored by Bierlein Moore dealership in Sebewaing. Keller Williams Lakeside of Caseville and Countryside Transportation of Sebewaing also sponsor the show. Registration starts at 9 a.m. Saturday and the event runs until 3 p.m. Awards presented at 2 p.m. About 60 cars, truck, and tractors are expected for the show and hundreds of visitors view the classic vehicles.

The historical society's Denim & Diamonds Event, a tribute to the late Dolly Parton, was a museum-wide exhibit of Dolly memorabilia provided by Brandon Dean of Cottage Outfitters in Caseville. More than 100 visitors toured the exhibit at the exhibit during the two-day event.

During the meeting, a nominating committee of Harold Hoelzle, Matt Filipovitch, and Marge Hall was established to elect board members and officers during the society's October meeting.

Members also agreed to establish a trade-school scholarship of \$500 for Caseville students that would be in addition to the Scholarship Committee's current \$500 college scholarship. The committee will set criteria to win the new award.

It was also decided during the meeting to change our annual Fall Feast & Auction to a pot-luck luncheon for members as a thank-you to all our volunteers after our November meeting.

Since our last meeting, 155 visitors (excluding events) toured the museum, according to the Museum and Archival Committee, which also noted recent donations from Christopher Stahl and T.J. Ellenbaum.

The historical society's next meeting is Thursday (September 17, 2026) at 10:00 a.m. in the museum. All meetings are open to the public and everyone is invited to attend.
