

#7 The Creamery

6468 Main Street (Private Residence)

The creamery was owned and operated by a farmer's association. It employed about 20 men. The main product was butter that was sold locally and as far away as New York City to candy-making companies. Butter was sold in large, 50 pound, wooden firkins. As grocery stores started selling butter, the creamery went out of business and the building was sold to Dr. Young from Cass City who used it as an office and residence. Bert & Sadie Curran sold their farm and bought the property from Dr. Young. Sadie was the post mistress for 20 years or more. Following their death, Eugene & Phillis Watterworth bought the property. The home was sold to Robert & Katheryn Harrison in 1973. In 1999, Donald LaBrosse bought the house, garage, and grounds as a 50th birthday present for his wife, Christine. Christine and Donald LaBrosse remain the current owners.
